

AAUW National Elections

AAUW national elections are now being held. If you haven't voted yet and want to vote for the national board of directors and proposed national policies and bylaws changes you can vote online or request a paper ballot. Information about voting can be found in your latest Outlook magazine and your membership number and voter pin number are on the back cover of the Outlook magazine. Paper ballots must be requested by May 4th. AAUW has again proposed to drop the educational requirement for AAUW membership. I know that is an issue that concerns members. The term Advocates in the proposed bylaws amendments refers to people who share AAUW's goals but do not meet current membership requirements. If you want your voice heard in determining the leadership and national policies of AAUW. now is the time to vote. Online voting and voting at convention end on June 9. Paper ballots must be postmarked by May 29. Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)

Exeter Township School District had a Spring into STEM night this week at the Reiffton School. I am a Community Partner in STEM committee member for the school district, representing our AAUW Reading Branch. I presented an activity on Buoyancy, which dealt with what characteristics of an object are needed for it to float float. About 400 people attended the event. The event was designed to encourage elementary and middle school students to consider careers in the STEM fields. Encouraging girls to consider careers in the STEM fields has been a focus of AAUW's for several years since there are job's available in those technical fields requiring less post- secondary education than other jobs with the same pay.


