

#### **AAUW National Elections**

AAUW national elections are now being held. If you haven't voted yet and want to vote for the proposed national policies and bylaws changes you can vote online or request a paper ballot. Information about voting can be found in your latest Outlook magazine and your membership number and voter pin number are on the back cover of the Outlook magazine. Paper ballots must be requested by May 7<sup>th</sup>. I know that there are issues that concern members. The proposed changes include a staggered board election, having members on the board who are not AAUW members and eliminating current educational membership requirements. If you want your voice heard in determining the leadership and national policies of AAUW. now is the time to vote. Online voting and voting at convention end on June 9 at 9PM. Paper ballots must be postmarked by May 21. #### Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)

Exeter Township School District had a Spring into STEM night last week at the Reiffton School. I am a Community Partner in STEM committee member for the school district, representing our AAUW Reading Branch. I presented an activity on producing electricity with a chemical change in a potato Participants put together a battery with potatoes, galvanized nails and copper wire to produce electricity to power a small digital clock display. About 400 people attended the event. The event was designed to encourage elementary and middle school students to consider careers in the STEM fields. Encouraging girls to consider careers in the STEM fields has been a focus of AAUW's for several years since there are job's available in those technical fields requiring less post- secondary education than other jobs with the same pay.


