18th Annual Women's Film Festival Coming to Reading LUNAFEST[®]: Short Films By, For, About Women[®]

LUNAFEST[®], the fundraising film festival dedicated to promoting awareness about women's issues, highlighting women filmmakers, and bringing women together in their communities, will be presented by the American Association of University Women, Reading PA Branch and hosted by Albright College's Women and Gender Studies and the NOW Student Chapter at Albright College's Student Center Klein Hall & Mezzanine, 13th & Bern Streets in Reading, PA on March 30.

This unique film festival highlights women as leaders in society, illustrated through nine short films by women filmmakers. The films range from animation to fictional drama, and cover topics such as women's health, body image, relationships, cultural diversity and breaking barriers.

All proceeds from LUNAFEST will benefit American Association of University Women, Reading, PA Branch, and Chicken & Egg Pictures, a nonprofit organization that supports women nonfiction filmmakers whose artful and innovative storytelling catalyzes social change. Thus far, LUNAFEST, which is created and funded by LUNA[®], The Whole Nutrition Bar for Women[®], has raised more than \$3 Million for nonprofit organizations across the US and Canada.
