



It's Personal

In an average year, gun violence in America kills 40,000 people, wounds twice as many, and has an economic consequence to our nation of \$557 billion, according to Everytown, a gun safety organization. This is five times the budget of the Dept, of Education, Everytown says. If shooting tragedies could be prevented, we would have adequate funds for schools, libraries and other things AAUW members value.

Costs include:

- * Police and ambulance services and the training and equipment they need
- * Security upgrades at schools, religious institutions, and other facilities
- * Emergency health care and continuing health care for survivors
- * Mental health care for the trauma of violence.

We pay through our taxes, our health insurance, and - because many companies provide their employees with health insurance and must ramp up their security - through rising prices of everything we buy.

Congress recently passed the first major gun safety legislation in decades, HR 7910. It doesn't ban any weapons and it expires in ten years. It does require enhanced background checks for younger gun buyers, but does not ban those under 21 from buying semiautomatic guns. It supports and provides some funding to encourage states to pass red flag laws. It funds some mental health and school safety programs. It cracks down on straw purchases. It does not impose universal background checks or ban the sale of large-capacity magazines. There is no mandatory waiting period for a gun sale. There is no license requirement to purchase an assault weapon.

Will it change our costs? Probably not. We live in a violent gun culture and it costs us dearly.

The LUNAFEST film festival screens live at 1 pm, and includes a lite lunch at 12 Noon, jewelry sale, and social networking! Our post film discussion offers our audience members the opportunity to expand the movie experience! LUNAFEST recommends attendance by those over 16 years old. Tickets can be purchased for \$30 online for the live screening which includes a lunch and films, and \$12.50 for the online virtual screening, at Eventive.com or Lunafest.org/screenings. Tickets will be available from AAUW members for the live screening for \$25 and tickets can be purchased at the door for \$30(lunch and films), if still available, or \$10 (films only).

Our fundraising efforts will be applied to AAUW branch operating expenses, and projects and events that benefit women in Berks County.
